To Del Ray Artisans members:

The Arts Hancock County has invited Del Ray Artisans members to be part of a very special *Thanks Y'all* art exhibit and event that they are hosting on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>August 29</u> in the Bay St. Louis, Mississippi, area commemorating the 10th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina.

The Arts Hancock County (TAHC) is an arts organization very similar in purpose, organization, and size to Del Ray Artisans (DRA). DRA members got to know members of TAHC during *Southern Surge*, DRA's benefit show for TAHC in March 2007. *Southern Surge*, curated by Theresa Kulstad and Linda Ellilff, was organized to give artists devastated by Katrina support and an opportunity to sell their art after Hurricane Katrina. The show expenses were completely paid for by DRA, and all of the artwork sales went directly to the artists. DRA members as well as the Del Ray community were exceptional in the various volunteer efforts they gave and long lasting friendships were formed.

This coming August 29, 2015 marks the 10th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina. There will be various ceremonies along the Mississippi Gulf Coast in the numerous towns. The Arts Hancock County (based in Bay St. Louis, MS) is holding an invitational art show to thank the art organizations around the country that came to their aid in the months after Katrina. Del Ray Artisans is among the groups being invited to participate. The Arts Hancock County activities are on Thursday, August 27 through Saturday, August 29.

Several documents have been received from The Arts Hancock County that provide more details and are included in the subsequent pages.

Important Information for Del Ray Artisans Members

DRA members are invited to ship or deliver in person their artwork to Bay St. Louis, MS. <u>Shipped artwork</u> must be received by Monday, August 24. See section "Artwork Delivery & Guidelines" for details.

Those travelling to Bay St. Louis are asked to provide some information to the host artists.

<u>Accommodation requests for visiting artists must be received by August 10.</u> See the "Schedule" and "Accommodations" sections for more information. A potluck dinner is being organized for local and visiting artists on Thursday, August 27. The exhibit reception will be in the evening on Saturday, August 29.

Participating DRA artists are asked to email Linda Elliff at Membership@TheDelRayArtisans.org with their name, phone number, artwork name, artwork size, and whether you are shipping or delivering the work in person to Bay St. Louis, MS. If possible, DRA will work on consolidating artworks to save shipping costs or hand carry some artworks to deliver in person. Shipping & handling costs are to be shared by the participating artists. Participating artists will be contacted individually with details.

Please note: Even though The Arts Hancock County is allowing artwork up to a size of 36" x 36", any hand carried artwork must be 20" x 24" maximum. Smaller, lightweight artworks are encouraged by DRA.




<u>Invitation to Participate</u>



We're going to have it on Saturday night, August 29, at the Ground Zero Hurricane Museum in Waveland. (Just so you'll know, Waveland and Bay St. Louis are neighboring communities and these events are within five miles of each other.)



This is a good, maybe even great, thing. Instead of having a stand-alone event, we're being invited to the BIG party with all the publicity and energy focused in one location. The Museum will have several different activities going on in one place so this will be THE place to be.



"Thanks Y'all" Exhibit Presented by The Arts, Hancock County Saturday, August 29, 2015 5:30 – 8:00 PM Ground Zero Hurricane Museum 335 Coleman Avenue, Waveland, MS 39576



On Saturday, August 29, artists from around the country will take part in tenth anniversary Katrina ceremonies by exhibiting work at a very special invitational art show. These artists and visitors will experience the legendary southern hospitality in repayment for the assistance they extended to local artists ten years ago.

After Katrina, many communities reached out to Hancock County artists and offered gallery shows, housing, and even travelling expenses for artists, to continue showing their work outside the storm stricken area of South Mississippi. Originally from Waveland, Claire Haun relocated to Little Rock post Katrina and planned the first exhibit, "Hearts for Art" in February 2006. She organized local Arkansas arts groups, who secured the Clinton Presidential Library for the event, hosted the show, and found families to house the 20 artists who made the trip. Not only did the Arkansas angels do this once, but also a second time, when a citywide ice storm, crippling Little Rock on the morning of the show, cancelled the first event. Not to be discouraged, the benevolent donors paid twice for airfare, as well as re-publicizing the event, and re-organizing sponsors and host families.

These acts of generosity were repeated in other cities across the country between 2006 and 2007. Arts organizations, guilds, and galleries from Minnesota, Georgia, North Carolina, Massachusetts, Indiana, and Pennsylvania hosted exhibits of Hancock County artists. The Washington, DC area hosted three separate events in two years.

The main reason for the exhibits was to offer viable economies that could focus on buying art, not rebuilding walls. Most of the artists sold work at all of the individual shows, many returning home with sizable checks. But when painters, sculptors, photographers, and musicians travelled to these charitable havens they were given a more valuable gift than money. The escape from "Katrina Fatigue" was an immeasurable boost to morale for the participants. Hosts welcomed artists into their homes with friendships and luxuries such as home-cooked meals and bathtubs with plenty of hot water. In many cases, bonds were established between artists and families that still remain.

The Arts, Hancock County now welcomes those artists and families who were so generous to participate in the upcoming Katrina observances on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. The exhibit, entitled "Thanks Y'all", borrows the phrase from an early statewide campaign recognizing the volunteers who came to our region.

Artists from other parts of the country will reunite with Hancock County artists and display their work in Bay St. Louis for a reciprocal exhibit. While the basis for the event is primarily to express gratitude for their generosity, it also demonstrates how their actions revitalized the local arts community. The Arts, Hancock County invites our visitors to see the progress we have made with their help since 2005.

On Saturday, August 29, the reception for the artists will be held from 5:30 to 8:00 at the Ground Zero Hurricane Museum in Waveland. The public is invited to come meet and thank the people who helped us get back on our feet. Admission is free and the art will be for sale.
