
The Financial Ground Beneath Us Linda Silk

Because money and financial security are the topics of so much conversation these days, this three-part series examines DRA's financial foundation. Last month the costs and benefits associated with membership were explained; this month we look at the organization's annual income.

Like many 501(c)(3)s, membership does not pay for everything. Other non-dues revenue streams are crucial. With an annual Operating Budget of roughly \$47,000, dues amount to only a fraction of the needed revenue. Exhibiting a new show each month, with its postcards and banners; and gallery staffing are not covered by dues. Program income, grants, donations and fundraising provide most of our support. And in today's climate of economic strife, grants are not all that certain

In recent years, DRA adopted a policy that shows and programs be more self-supporting. In other words, they pay for themselves. So, curators and organizers are in effect "loaned" seed money through a budget to produce a show or event that will attempt to pay back the loan through entry fees, registration, admission and donations. The challenge to break- even has led to some innovative solutions that have enhanced DRA's offerings: several shows a year are now accompanied by weekend workshops that draw even more visitors to our door, and we have had several successful marketplace/boutiques that yield revenue for both artists and DRA, while offering more art for patrons.



But not every event can be self-sustaining, especially outreach initiatives, e.g. the annual Student Art Show and the like. Donations and grants play a huge role in supporting DRA's outreach programs. The energy some members contribute by writing grant applications and researching corporate donor opportunities is invaluable. Note: If you are willing to volunteer your professional knowledge towards this endeavor, please contact the Volunteer Director.

Of course, who doesn't like to have fun with a fundraiser? These have been some of our most popular and effective revenue generators. So next month, we'll look at ways you can have fun helping to raise money for DRA without digging into your own pocket!


