Del Ray Artisans welcomes the strange, odd, and out of perspective: fish eye lens, mirror images, strange colors, impossible structures, pigs that fly, animals that dance. *Through the Looking Glass* is an ode to the childhood

Call for Proposals: 2018 Art Exhibits at Del Ray Artisans



The Desk

In twenty-five years, DRA has accumulated a lot of memories - some stressed, some fun - but it's all good. One constant for DRA has been our desk. It has survived many attempts to get rid of it, upgrade it, recreate it, and yet it has survived. Some have thought of it as an albatross or an anchor – but others prefer to think of it as a solid foundation, DRA's Rock of Gibraltar. Through DRA's multiple locations where we share our artists' creations, that desk has followed (or led) us around. It has been a love/hate relationship - but whenever there is an attempt to abandon it or replace it with more attractive storage capability - the desk has always won! Visualize transporting that heavy desk manually up and down the Avenue to find a better home. It could be thought of as DRA's longest living member. It has

witnessed many wonderful Presidents and gallery hosts and receptions. It is time to reflect on the history of the desk.

In 1996, when DRA was in Dennis Reeder's building at 2003 Mt. Vernon Avenue, the former Del Ray Hardware, the desk was stashed in the back storage area. It was donated to us vagabonds (in our 3rd space already) by John Mennell, and we brought it out into the light - where it has been ever since. That space is now Executive Lock & Key. We moved (with the desk) to 2310 Mt. Vernon Avenue, which until recently housed the Dairy Godmother - for a month! The desk then followed us like a puppy to 2213, space donated to DRA by Gary and Sally Christian, where Bean Creative is now. Transportation was by brute force—carried by a small army along the street! It finally led us to our space in the Colasanto Center. It was no easy feat to lift it up into the back of a truck to move it, but that was probably accomplished by founding members Bob Larson, Nick Bayus, and former Co-President Martin Angebranndt.

While it is heavy, it is solid and strong and lasting like DRA. The storage capability has been beneficial over the years. Receptions, a DRA hallmark, centered around the desk. Food was well displayed whenever the top was cleared and served in that capacity. It has also served as the display for our bake sales, benefitting those less fortunate, during our Holiday Markets. It remains a source for display and distribution of our newsletter, *The Well-Crafted Word*, fliers and postcards. And, any of you who have gallery hosted have sat behind its vast surface, where every inch is needed and used! And now you know – it houses quite a lively bit of DRA history!
