"From Temples to Teapots: The Architect as Artisan" Scheduled to Open at Del Ray Artisans' Center Tuesday, February 2, 1993

The opening exhibition kicking off the 1993 calendar at Del Ray Artisans' Center will be "From Temples to Teapots: The Architect as Artisan," featuring selected student projects from last semester's Materials Workshop at the Washington-Alexandria Architecture Consortium, an extension of the School of Architecture and Urban Studies at Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Virginia.

The student projects to be featured are "sources of illumination." Each student in the Materials Workshop was required to produce and present three items as part of this design and construction exercise: a scale model of the structure or environment to be illuminated, a light and shadow study of the source of illumination as it is envisioned within that structure or environment, and a full-scale, working prototype of the source of illumination.

These student projects - which were presented to the Washington-Alexandria Architecture Center's faculty on December 10th - demonstrate the participating students' abundance of vision, imagination, and creativity in design and construction. The students did not shy away from the challenge of designing for less than user-friendly materials, as evidenced by the number of prototypes which incorporate metals.

This exhibition will be enlightening and inspiring to anyone who has ever marvelled at the apparent complexity of light fixtures but always assumed that they could be produced only by large lighting manufacturers. If these student projects are any indication, while the range of stock light fixtures may be limited, the boundaries of the creative designer are limitless.
