ONE MAN'S ART OPENS MARCH 22ND

The DEL RAY ARTISANS CENTER is proud to present a retrospective exhibtion featuring the artwork of member Matt Debevec. Matt lived and worked in Del Ray with his wife, Sue and son Derek, for the last fifteen years. A skilled painter, sculptor and student of nature, Matt created beauty out of ordinary materials. He had faced considerable adversity, having lost an arm to cancer in his 20's. Last summer he was diagnosed with leukemia and died this December.

Matt was a remarkable man who overcame great odds whether he was creating artwork, repairing his truck, building cabinets or trimming trees! A lover of nature he planted a profuse garden of butterfly bushes, berries, bonzai, six foot tall roses and fruit trees. He dug out four feet of earth to create two beautiful fish ponds in his Randolph Avenue backyard.

However, he was very private about his artwork. Matt studied at the Cleveland Institute of Art and at Kent State University in Kent, Ohio. Though he created sculptures in wood and bronze and paintings both abstract and realistic, Matt wouldn't talk about his artwork. Now, his friends are mounting an exhibition to honor his artwork and his life. Donations in Matt's memory can be made to further the leukemia research of Dr. Geraldine Schechter, Institute of Clinical Research at VA Hospital, P.O. Box 29545, Washington, D.C. 20017.

ART DIRECTORY COMMITTEE FORMING

At the February Membership meeting Sarah Pearson laid out plans and a suggested timeline for creating an Artists Directory for publication this year. The directory would present a color photo and a biography or marketing information about each artist. The fee for participating would be approximately \$40. The directory would be used by artists to market their work and be distributed to a variety of businesses. organizations and individuals. Sarah's idea is to contact 96 artists to participate in the project which is tentatively known as '96 in '96. This large undertaking will require the talents of many of us. Sarah has generously agreed to coordinate the project but she is seeking others to form a committee to handle various aspects of the job. These are the areas where you can get involved:

Campaign Phase (March - May 1) - outreach to artists, distributing forms, explaining the concept to them and then following up to collect the photo, text and fee. This should be a fun phase which will involve meeting and talking to lots of new and old acquaintances, and then encouraging those artists to draw in their friends as well. (Isn't this how Amway started?)

Administrative Phase (March - May 15): Track the entries, coordinate with Marlin Lord and Kathryn Brown our Treasurers, Prepare a Master Copy of the Data to give to Design/Production folks.

Design/Production Phase (May 15 - August 1): Be the brains behind the directory. Decide how it will be organized. Design the cover. Make decisions about the overall look of the directory...A wonderful artistic opportunity.

Distribution Phase: (August - October 15)

Work closely with the artists featured in the directory to develop a list of prespective recipients of the directory. What can we do to get them into the hands of clients, businesses and individuals who will use the directory to hire our artists? Decide how best to announce the distribution of the directory...a kick-off reception with a local celebrity?

We are very excited about this undertaking and feel that it will be an excellent opportunity for DEL RAY ARTISANS to serve the art community and meet many prospective members. A portion of the entry fee will go to DEL RAY ARTISANS. We hope to generate funds as well as good will with this venture. To get involved call Sarah Pearson at 703-690-0260.
