We will make valentines as well as other custom creations. If you're not an artist don't despair, we will help you develop those skills that have been asleep since kindergarten!

For a few hours we will cut out shapes, glue photos, collage using beautiful papers, print with potatoes or erasers. Choose your medium! Bring what you have to work with. Some ideas may include paints, brushes, metallic threads, needles, ribbon, pressed flowers or herbs, photos, magazines (to cut up) scissors, glue and potatoes. Inspiration will be on hand such as interesting cards, craft magazines, art books. Some supplies will be provided by the Artisans, but this is a cooperative effort so bring whatever materials and ideas you can share. This event is about expression, creativity and community.
