

ARTISANS PLAN SPRING/SUMMER COMMUNITY YOUTH PROJECTS

This spring and summer DRA offer a Student Art Show, the Learning Garden and a week-long Art Camp

The Learning Garden is a joint project between the DRA and the Virginia Cooperative Extension which sponsors both the Master Gardener Program and Power Up, an after school 4-H program at George Washington Middle School.

The DRA committee plans to landscape the area around the Nicholas A. Colasanto Center to enhance the space as a contribution to the community, and to provide students with gardening and art experiences. Some committee ideas include Artisan-developed furnishings, such as colorful benches and creative pavers (made with the students) and sculpture.

The committee has prepared draft plans and hopes to develop a shallow fountain area with seating.

Help is also needed to prepare raised beds for the initial garden and the students' vegetable and flower beds. Soil samples have been prepared and it's anticipated that we need to enrich some or all the areas to be planted.

Cathy Clark, an Americorp volunteer for the Power Up program, reports that the students are ready to get their hands dirty. They'll not only get gardening experience, but will also participate in arts and crafts based on the garden--poetry, photography, paper maché, painting, building... Cathy would like to have DRA assistance with these projects. The students and DRA members will exhibit their artwork after the growing season.

Del Ray Artisan Spotlight: Alice Cannon

(Alice recently curated the Creativity Has No Age exhibit featuring her students from the senior citizens' art class and jewelry making class that she teaches at the Mt. Vernon Recreation Center.)

Alice taught art for the first time in two large group homes for children in Jamaica; she was 18 years old. "I can't remember a time when I wasn't drawing and making things."

Majoring in literature at Bennington College, she continued to study drawing and painting and went on to get an M.Ed. and became a teacher. When she had children she did art projects with them and their friends and volunteered doing supplementary art activities with kindergartners.

She took one of the very first polymer clay workshops at the Torpedo Factory with Kathleen Dunstin about 12 years ago and began exploring jewelry making soon after. This led to her ongoing study of metal grafting.

Jewelry making is what brought her into DRA and led to her friendship with Helen Ottoway, who asked her to take over teaching the art class for the Alexandria Dept. of Rec. seniors program when Helen moved to Washington state.

"I was was delighted and challenged. I knew I could teach children, but I had never taught adults. I discovered it's exhilerating to work with adult students. The seniors in this class are engaged and excited about learning, and have such rich life experiences—they are an inspiration.

"Because the class wanted to work in watercolor, I started taking classes to learn how to use the medium myself. Now we are learning together and I'm delighted.

"Working with the seniors has redirected my attention back to painting again and has confirmed my belief that everyone who wants can learn to draw and that this skill realized greatly enriches our daily life through illuminated seeing."
