Stimulating colors and unexpected textures are part of the visual vocabulary that communicates that this is what it is like to be "A Pig in Paradise," the title of a quilt by Ginny Smith.

The quilts and embellished clothing in this show represents a selection of contemporary quilters from the Arlington chapter of the Quilters Unlimited. This exquisite show exhibits the art of an elite group of quilters nationally recognized in books, articles and juried shows.

Hot Times in Cool Seasons, an exhibition of hot quilts runs from January 15 through February 7, gallery hours are Saturdays, 10am to 4pm; Sundays, 12noon to 4pm. There will be Quilting Bee demonstrations during show times.

#### COMING UP AT THE DRA GALLERY:

"Be Moved!" A Kinetic Collaboration:

Artwork by the Del Ray Artisans, Dances by Mary Jo Smet, Janet Stormes and Jane Franklin.

Dance performance Friday, February 19, 7pm to 8pm, is at the Mt. Vernon Recreation Center adjacent to the Del Ray Artisans' Gallery in the Nicholas Colasanto Center. Opening reception for Artwork Inspired by Motion immediately following from 8pm to 10pm at the Del Ray Artisans' Gallery.

The Del Ray Artisans latest member show "Be Moved!" focuses on the power of movement to inspire art. Mixed media takes on a new meaning as sculpture photos and paint shimmer, leap and twirl. "We wanted to bring dance into the community," states choreographer Mary Jo Smet who proposed the collaboration with the Del Ray Artisans.

Here's what to expect of the Performance: Layers of color, sound and beauty, bodies in motion flowing through space. The viewer will be engaged in an emotional collage complete with splashes of color and experience a tapestry of surprising moods. The music swings from Kenny Rogers and Washington composer Alexandra Gardner, to Buxtehude, a contemporary of Bach.

Choreographer Jane Franklin's dance "Sticky/Greasy, Windy/Wild" was inspired by artist Carrie Beyer's carnival images. In "Of Separate Voice, I Sing" Janet Stormes and Mary Jo Smet have co-choreographed a dance that explores the complexity of the human character. Artist

Rene Niver's life sized collage serves as a backdrop for this beautifully executed piece. "Quiet Rhythms," a solo choreographed by Janet Stormes, reflects the contemplative quality of nature as the recitation of five poems captures observations in nature and relates them to life.

The Exhibit: As you move through the exhibit you become part of the images projected on the walls from Marlin Lord's slides which catch nature in motion. Feast your eyes on the power and beauty of sculptor, David Martin's exquisite bronze nudes. Rearrange the pieces of Thalia Doukas' "Moving Parts Collage" based on nature's four elements. You'll want to play with "Harlequin" a hand carved marionette that sprung from the imagination of artist Linda Silk. Be Moved! allows the Del Ray Artisans to showcase a full range of skills in fine and functional art. This riot of artwork celebrates motion and draws the viewer into the magic of the moment.

According to Niver, "Dance Place features a great venue for dance performances, featuring resident, local & national choreographers & dancers AND each month they feature a different visual artist on a wall in the ticket area outside the performance space."

Niver is scheduled to show 3 collage/mixed media pieces at Dance Place in March. "Dancing Spirit," 8ft.x 4ft., will also be featured in the Feb. 19 DRA collaborative performance BE MOVED! with Mary Jo Smet at Mt. Vernon Rec. Center as a set piece in the work she has choreographed entitled "Of Sep-

arate Voices I Sing." This collage, composed of textured papers and fiber paint, is currently on display at Potomac West Alliance (PWA).

"Coucher du soleil" is also currently at PWA. It is made of textured and hand-marbleized papers in sunset hues which ascend up the slopes of a mountain. It also incorporates other materials such as moss, string and lichens.

"Dreams" also uses objects found in nature, including a honeycomb, Japanese lanterns, dried roses, rose petals and feathers floating on a background of textured papers.
