he romance of the Mediterranean has inspired artists for centuries. The palette of rich sienna rooftops, the washed tones of a mud-bricked wall, the blues of the sky and water—are all revealed in Lungo il Mediterraneo, a multi-media invitational exhibit inspired by the travels and reflections of seven artists. Venture into the Mediterranean this spring. Experience the climate and terrain through a variety of media. Feel the effects of Mediterranean hues on the soul. Journey through the by-ways and streetscapes of Tuscany and Rome. View antique and contemporary architecture and sense the ever-changing perspective of statues and sculptures.

Photographer Kathryn Brown masterfully captures the light of the Mediterranean in her black and white studies of Italian antique and contemporary buildings.

Painter Frederick Holl exhibits large, vibrant acrylic paintings, each embracing a slice of Mediterranean life.

The evidence of James Evans' training in England and Italy is revealed in his baroque ornamental carvings and egg tempera paintings, rich in detail and golden splendor.

The multi-media talent of Tara Holl, recognized for her stained and sculptural glasswork and painted wall murals, is displayed in her glass paintings and environmental portraits from Greece and Italy.

TORPEDO FACTORY ART CENTER'S FOUNDING

On April 8, at 7:30 PM, the Torpedo Factory will host a book signing event and reception to introduce the publication of "On Target, Stories of the Torpedo Factory Art Center's First 25 Years." This entertaining, documentary-style account of the establishment and development of the internationallyknown art center, written by founder Marian Van Landingham, will be available starting that day.

That same evening, the public is invited to attend one of the premiere performances of Torpedo, An Opera in Four Acts, music and libretto written by the fourth graders of John Adams Elementary School in Alexandria, Va. The opera chronicles the history of the Torpedo Factory, which was built in 1918, to its present reincarnation as an art center. The cast of fourth graders portray Ms. Van Landingham along with the 1974 Alexandria city council, then-mayor, Charles Beatley and President Woodrow Wilson, among other real-life characters.
