Modeled Space and Space Modeled

Exhibit to Open February 4th

During the month of February, Del Ray Artisans will host an exhibition entitled "Modeled Space and Space Modeled" which will feature architectural projects (models and drawings) by students from the Catholic University School of Architecture and Planning. The exhibit, which opens Friday, February 4th with a reception scheduled from 7 to 10pm will continue through Sunday, February 27th. The exhibit is designed to give the public an opportunity to visualize how the students think about the space surrounding their design challenge and the space within the enclosures that they are creating.

During the opening reception, those attending are encouraged to meet with the architectural students and participate in discussions of the students' concepts for dealing with the design and its subsequent translation in to a spatial model. Also on view at the show will be large murals featuring various urban tectonic scenes in the Washington metropolitan area.

The coordinator of "Modeled Space" is Gregory K. Hunt, AIA, the Dean of Catholic University's School of Architecture and Planning. He is being assisted by Eric Jenkins and Marlin G. Lord, AIA. According to Dean Hunt, "Our thinking is to have an exhibit of architectural models of various sorts—from conceptual, process works to more finished presentation models. By doing so, we would hope to bring to the public's attention the range of model types architects employ in the design of the built environment." Lord adds, "It was my intent, as curator, that this show would be like giving the public a look inside the architect's head and perhaps could be considered the fountainhead revisited."

Gallery hours for this exhibit will be Saturdays from 10AM to 4PM and Sundays from noon to 4PM.

Del Ray Artisans has established an art scholarship fund named in honor of Ted Eichers, an active Del Ray Artisans' member until his death on October 24, 1997. The scholarship committee consists of members Mart Larson, Dr. Patty Lewis, Alice Eichers, and Marlin Lord. Additionally Danny Eichers, Ted and Alice's son, has joined the committee. The scholarship is funded by a Del Ray Artisans' interestbearing account. An initial amount of \$500 will be awarded this year to an art student from T.C. Williams High School who plans on majoring in an art-related field either at NVCC, a university, or an art school. The presentation will be made through the Alexandria Scholarship Fund, on May 16th at 6:30PM at T.C. Williams High School.

A preview of the presentation of the "Del Ray Artisans – Ted Eichers Memorial Art Scholarship" will be made to the selected student at the reception for the Student Art Show at the center in May.

Ted and Alice's children have made a contribution to the Scholarship Fund as a Christmas gift to their mother. Additional contributions can be made directly to the fund and will be accepted at any time.
