Terry Field premiers Irish Blessings, a suite inspired by the Celtic folksongs of Alexandria's Irish Breakfast Band (1999 winner of Irish/Celtic record of the year), who will be performing live. Doorway to Memories (Les Portes de Souvenir), a solo performed and created by Amey St. Clair, reviews the different stages of a love relationship from the celebrated beginning to the tulmultous ending. Homeland to the Soul, a solo performed by Mary Jo Smet, is a collaboration between choreographer Janet Stormes and poet and artist Renee Niver.

In addition, choreographers Judith Sewickley and Mary Jo Smet (with singer Alison Valtin) will present works.

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Ted Eichers

Ted Eichers grew up on a Minnesota farm, in the shadow of St. John's Abby, he lived near Cold Spring, a village inhabited by the German-speaking children and grandchildren of pioneer homesteaders. Ted was the only one of 8 children to leave this traditional life and take on a career in a distant city. Military service exposed him for the first time to climates where winters were short and mild—and summers that, incredibly, might stretch through September.

He liked to recall the late summer day in 1957 when, fresh out of the University of Minnesota, he guided his old Plymouth down Connecticut Avenue for the first time, surprised and delighted that flowers were still in bloom. That month he began his 29 year career with the Department of Agriculture and his 40 years of life in Washington.

Settled into his new home and job, he then turned to the next item of business: find a woman! To accomplish this he did what any good Catholic young man would do in the 1950's—he went to his parish priest for suggestions. Within weeks of arriving in DC, his found his way to St. Matthew's Cathedral Catholic young adult group and met Alice. They were married in Silver Spring on April 4, 1959. The family moved to Arlington on Labor Day Weekend, 1966, with three pre-schoolers, and a first grader. Two more children were born in the 1970's.

Over the years, Ted had been working on a PhD in economics. By the birth of his 6th child he was ready to begin a dissertation. Faced with a choice between completing his degree and participating more fully in the rearing of his children, he chose the latter—and gave his children, grandchildren; and, in retirement, the wider community, the immeasurable gift of his interest, time, and energy.

Ted's inner beauty was recognized by people of all ages—even small children were drawn to him, especially babies. He could entertain even the fussiest of infants with his gentle touch and funny faces. Ted was a very energetic man, right up to the very last moments of his life. He loved to keep moving. He skied and sailed, he biked and rowed, he even line-danced. He loved running after the dog and his grandchildren. There were few occasions when he wasn't sporting a homemade bandage over a cut hand or bruised finger that he'd just hit with a hammer, injuries he would ignore with typical prairie-grown stoicism.

Ted's interest in creating art did not spring to life until he retired at age 58. He gradually evolved a style of working with wood veneers that he found satisfying.

Ted's really significant legacy lies not in the artwork that he left, but in the many lives that he touched. Retiring in demeanor, he nonetheless loved meeting people and learning new things. Ted's quiet, joyful spirit reached out to an incredible diversity of humanity—offering companionship to lonely nursing home residents, comfort to the bereaved, sharing his wisdom and skill with inmates of the county jail, and at-risk youth in Alexandria.

Ted's warmth was summed up well by an Armenian refugee and artist, Martin Zakarian, whom Ted tutored in English, and who later became a good friend. When told of Ted's death, he declared "Mr. Ted was so full of life; he was like a wise child. Because of Mr. Ted, I loved America."
