Sticks, Stones & Bones: Amulets for Everyday Usage

Coming June 30th

Humankind has been creating amulets for thousands of years, imparting mystical properties to everyday objects in order to bring good luck or ward off evil. With Del Ray Artisans' upcoming exhibit, Sticks, Stones & Bones: Amulets for Everyday Usage, curators Larisa Sjoerds and Susan Slattery will create an exciting, intriguing show with equal parts of spiritualism, superstition, ceremonies, religious beliefs, and even anthropology. However, it will also be a playful show that examines the role of amulets and talismans in our everyday lives. Participating artists are invited to portray what inspires them, what they pray for and how, and what they consider to be their rituals and amulets.

Among the anticipated highlights of "Amulets" will be a labyrinth constructed in the DRA gardens by artist Sabrina Allinson. Labyrinths are ancient spiritual tools used to enhance prayer and meditation through an integration of mind and body. Last summer, Allinson had the opportunity to work in a community with a labyrinth and it became an integral part of her own meditation practice. Visitors to the Amulets exhibit will be encouraged to walk the labyrinth.

Reinforcing the role of amulets as being an accessible part of today's modern society, a Recycled / Urban Amulet-making Workshop will be held on Saturday, July 8 (time to be announced). Teacher and artist Thalia Doukas will lead students of any age or ability level in interpreting amulets on a personal and individual basis. Participants will create a durable token to wear, hang in a window or on a car rearview mirror for inspiration, protection, or good luck.

The exhibit opens Friday, June 30th (opening reception is from 7-10PM) and runs through Sunday, July 23, 2000.

One of the unique features of this particular exhibit is the "Artful Scavenger Hunt" that visitors can participate in when they visit the gallery. The hunt will involve young viewers in the art created by their contemporaries and encourage them to see and experience the pieces beyond their surface appearances.
