ver the past year the DRA garden has benefited from many caring individuals and local businesses. In the spring of 2000 a group of DRA members met and decided to develop the basic overall plan visualized by Bob Larson and Susan Buchan. The garden committee met several times during the spring and made the decision to move forward by maintaining the existing garden. Taking the advice of landscaping experts at the Merrifield Garden Center the committee planted shrubs and perennials along the gallery's foundation. A Virginiana Magnolia or Sweet Bay Magnolia was planted to the right of the building.

Ornamental grasses were planted to camouflage electrical equipment. A decision was made not to over commit ourselves or plant a garden that would be difficult to maintain and afford. Each season we hope that our garden will improve and grow and change. Future plans include a sculpture or water fountain in the front of the gallery, new signage and walkways to entice visitors to explore our garden.

Merrifield Garden Centers in Merrifield and Chantilly gave

25% discount for the plants. Many thanks to George Chadwick of the Alexandria Commission of the Arts who contacted manager Ken Kihenjo of Home Depot. Home Depot contributed mulch, topsoil, potting soil, garden benches, and soaker hoses. Richard Lukas contributed his plumbing skills to install an exterior faucet.
