4th Annual Student Art Show

Del Ray Artisans will present the 4th Annual Student Art Show, featuring art work by students of T.C. This show is the result of a yearlong collaborative effort between the faculty of Alexandria's 6th through 12th grade art departments, their students, and the Del Ray Artisans.

Outstanding student work will be selected by a panel of judges, led by curator Linda Silk, to receive awards in various media; including ceramics, collage, crafts, drawing and painting, graphics, and print making. Silk, whose lifelong love of art and early memories of her small Pennsylvania town's annual Founders' Day student art show, was inspired to create this opportunity for Alexandria's young artists in 1998.

Various responsibilities can include volunteering to coordinating committees—Coordinators: Volunteer, Graphics, Gallery Communications, Public Relations, Membership. Aid other Directors and Curators in preparing mailings, hosting events, landscaping, gallery maintenance, and show logistics. Locating outside speakers or instructors for special events, including talks. Assist with OffBeat Auction and Del Ray Farmers Market. Communicate with other galleries. Develop grant proposals. Solicit membership for ideas and services. Gallery sit and/or provide access to the gallery.

Adopt-A-Park Volunteers

We have once again been accepted into the Adopt-A-Park program run by the City. Our assignment is the Colasanto Park adjacent to the Del Ray Artisans' Gallery. The program runs from April 1 through November 30 and could result in a total of \$960 for Del Ray Artisans. Last year we earned \$720 and the previous year \$700. Marlin Lord has agreed to coordinate the program but volunteers are needed to spend about 15-20 minutes on a Saturday or Sunday to pick up litter. City staff tour the parks once a month on an undisclosed Monday, and score points by deducting for paper, cans, bottles, glass, etc. that have not been picked up. Ten dollars is given for each point earned (not deducted). The area we monitor is from the intersection of Mount Vernon and Commonwealth Avenues south to the north fence of the tennis court and the north fence of the pool. Points are not supposed to be deducted for the bus shelter but we pick up around that and we generally pick up around the Colasanto Center as well. This is an easy way to earn a nice chunk of change for DRA with just a little effort. We have used the funds from the first year to pay for most of the landscaping that has been done around the Gallery, and we have envisioned many more enhancements.

Some weekends have been taken by volunteers but we still have lots of openings! We need volunteers for a lot of weekends. Please contact Marlin Lord at 703.683.1112 or mglaid@aol.com to schedule your time.

Gallery without Walls


