## Art camp 2001: A success

The Del Ray Artisans 2001 Art Camp, which took place the week of July 9th—13th, was extremely successful. Nineteen students attended and, in keeping with the Del Ray mission statement four of those students were on full scholarships and two students were on partial scholarships. One of our students attended on behalf of the Potomac West Business Association, who had purchased a camp space as a prize for their Turkey Trot drawing contest.

It was reported in the July/August newsletter that our six instructors were volunteering their time to teaching Art Camp, an act of generosity for which the Del Ray Artisans were extremely grateful. The Artisans were awarded with generous grant from the Alexandria Commission for the Arts, which allowed us to give our incredible instructors a stipend for their time and efforts.

The response from the Art Camp students was excellent. All nineteen students reported that they had a great time. The two favorite comments made by students concerned the collage painting (taught by Marie Nierenberger) "it was hard, but it made me feel like a real artist;" and gourd making (taught by Bridget Belkacemi) "(I) didn't know (I) could do so much with funny looking vegetables." In the felt-making class (taught by Barbara Brecher) all the students pieced together a communal quilt that will be auctioned off at the Del Ray Artisans OffBeat Auction. Visitors to the Art Camp Reception expressed their surprise and delight to the high quality of the art the students produced. The instructors were proud of all the lovely pieces created by the Art Camp students.

We would like to thank our student aides Kimberly and Stephanie and all of our DRA volunteers including: Mart Larson, Sue Kuelsher, Jane DeWeerd, Pat Stepper, Jane Stockdale, Becky Heavner, Adina Russell, Alice Kale, Gale Goldfarb, and Renee Niver. Liz Martinez would like to extend a special thank you to Theresa DiJoseph who stepped in to teach the Beads 'n' Things class when illness prevented Liz from enjoying the Art Camp experience.


