with bright daubs of paper with bright daubs of paint, Del Ray Artisans member Beverly Hansen creates decoupage home accessories alive with vitality and whimsy. She calls it contemporary decoupage, and her style is very unlike that of many decoupeurs, because you can't always tell where the paper edges end and the paint embellishment begins.

It all began several years ago when Beverly was an interior decorator and as such had plenty of opportunity to see the trends in home decor accessories. After repeatedly seeing accessories that she felt she could make herself, she began to experiment with decoupage and was immediately hooked. Boldly she quit her job and took the leap into self-employment as an accessories designer/craftsperson. With an inventory of a mere 5 decoupage plates, she met with the Gift Buyer at Nordstrom's to get an assessment of their marketability. The buyer was very enthusiastic and bought everything Beverly could produce!

For the next five years, Nordstrom's was a big client for Beverly, and along with doing trunk

The 16th annual "Young" at Art show, sponsored by the Alexandria Commission on Aging, The Friends of the Torpedo Factory Art Center and the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP), will be held at The Campagna Center 418 S. Washington Street from July 21-August 1. The show is open to all metro artists aged 55+. The fee for entering is \$10 for the first three works and \$5 for each additional entry. Last year, 68 artists submitted 188 pieces; 77 were chosen for the show. Awards include cash prizes for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places plus ribbons for 5 Honorable Mentions.

Party Animal

RA member Debbie Mezzetta $oldsymbol{U}$ was recently selected as a winner of the national design competition through the Washington, DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities. The "Party Animals" exhibition will involve decorating donkeys and elephants to celebrate the familiar mascots of the Republican and Democratic national political parties. She is one of 200 artists out of over 1,500 entries from across the country who submitted their designs. Debbie will be painting an elephant in the studio space supplied to the artists in the old Woodward and Lothrup building in downtown Washington DC. All "party animals" must be completed by April 12! Each of the polyurethane icons stands 4.5 feet tall by 5 feet long.

A media event will be held in Washington DC on April 23, 2002. These "Party Animal" statues will be installed at various sites throughout the Washington, DC area in April and will continue to be on display until the autumn of 2002. The exhibition will culminate with the "Raucous Caucus Auction" and all proceeds will be channeled back to the DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities grant programs.

shows at their many area stores, she did special orders for their customers. It was through this arrangement that Beverly was able to build an affluent international client base which is still strong today. Special orders would vary from a set of plates for an Englishwoman, to a souvenir for a Japanese businessman to take back home. One special order that Beverly was particularly pleased with was a large decoupage glass platter commemorating the wedding between two champagne families in France. Starting with the wedding invitation, Beverly added pictures of the chateaux, images of goblets, and other papers that inspired her to end up with a memorable heirloom. She has since used this technique of framing

an announcement for many other special event gifts.

Of course, finding the perfect scraps of paper is critical to create the kind of lush, cohesive decoupage "tapestry" that Beverly favors. She has boxes upon boxes of novelty papers in her home, and files of images under the headings of FACES, CATS, etc. "I have been saving scraps of paper for, like, 25 years," says Beverly. (Considering that Beverly started collecting paper nearly 10 years before she began working in decoupage, you might wonder why. The answer is simple enough—she has always loved to paint and her paintings typically had an element of collage in them.) So when Beverly first starts a decoupage piece she spends hours, sometimes days, seeking out the perfect elements from her stash. Then she spends just as long figuring out the arrangement, fitting each snippet together like a puzzle. A special order piece could take anywhere from 2 to 4 weeks to make.

A self-taught decoupage artist, Beverly is very open in teaching others what she has learned. For the last 2 Offbeat auctions Beverly has taught public workshops on decoupage, assisting the process of creating unique furniture from castoffs. But though she can demonstrate the process she goes through, her eye for composition, color, and yes, humor, is a talent that just can't be copied.

Today, local retailers such as Artisans in McLean and Crystal Galleria in Tyson's Corners Shopping Center carry Beverly's work and take special orders for her. Plus, she is usually a vendor at Art on the Avenue and DRA's Holiday Show & Sale. And as a member of the National Guild of Decoupeurs, she will be exhibiting her work at their annual convention and exposition in Old Town this month (April 10-13). A first for her, Beverly is entering 2 platters for judging there. Good luck, "Beffie."
