Your Input Sought for DRA BoD

Participants of the Del Ray
Artisans Retreat held July 13 &
14 had lots of ideas to share
and discuss for shaping the future of
the organization. The Sunday "Nuts
and Bolts" session of the two-day
retreat focused on the many items
brought up at the Saturday "Ideas and
Visioning" session.

The most time was devoted to a discussion of restructuring the Board of Directors. There was general agreement on the duties of officers, which were specified in general terms. Participants also supported having each director take on an area of responsibility. Directors would be free to enlist the help of others, such as forming a committee, or could do the work themselves. The participants recommended that directors be required to attend three-quarters of scheduled board meetings.

Unresolved was whether two-three additional vice presidents should be elected, with each one overseeing directors with appropriate responsibilities, or whether this added an unnecessary level of bureaucracy. The alternative was having the directors report directly to the president. It would be the responsibility of each director to inform the president of any topic to be added to the meeting agendas.

Among the possible directorships and their duties considered:

Programs — workshops, demonstrations, art talks, gallery activities and art camp.

Communications - publicity, mar-

keting, production of a "who we are" brochure, the Well Crafted Word, the DRA web site, coordinated graphics.

Membership — maintain mailing list, welcome new members, produce directory, send out renewal notices, get update membership cards to renewing members, seek additional benefits for members (such as existing discount at Pearl Art Supplies).

Outreach — promote DRA in the community and region, Art on the Avenue, scholarships, participation in Earth Day, First Thursday, festivals, etc.

Fund raising — OffBeat Auction, sale of T-shirts and tote bags, cardmaking parties, special events, seeking grants and benefactors, Adopt-a-Park.

Facilities — maintenance and upgrading of the Colasanto Center, exterior landscaping and gardening, signage, lighting, computer maintenance, deaning.

Volunteers — the need for fresh faces in the volunteer cadre was seen as the motivation for a position devoted solely to the recruitment and "care and feeding" of volunteers. This director would coordinate with the director in charge of membership to quickly contact new members who have indicated an interest in volunteering. Adding categories of volunteer jobs to the membership application was advocated. The director would schedule volunteers for DRA events-exclusive of gallery-sitting, which is the responsibility of show participantsand look into special perks for volunteers.

Duties of officers were also discussed:

President — create agenda, conduct meetings, serve as liaison with board members, represent DRA in the community and at other events and meetings, or delegate other representatives.

Vice President — share duties of president, conduct meetings in president's absence.

Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer — keep accounts, prepare financial reports, handle Internal Revenue Service matters, collect and open mail to receive membership applications, payments and bills and forward other mail appropriately. Forward membership information to appropriate board members.

Secretary — keep minutes of board meetings, keep corporate records, update bylaws, handle correspondence.

The need for directors to serve as Historian/Architect and Curators' Coordinator were discussed. The group wanted to discuss future OffBeat Auctions and alternate meeting formats but was prevented by time constraints.

If you are interested in running for the board, please consider which of the above committees you are willing to head up. Nominations will be held at the August 13th general meeting (you can nominate yourself) and the vote will be taken at the September meeting. Any questions regarding this proposal can be addressed at the August general meeting.

He has a flair for painting simple subjects in a loose and free style. His paintings would probably be categorized as impressionist or realistic, but whatever you call them you will like them.

Gilbert has been painting in the local area for about three years. He is a member of the Del Ray Artisans, the Alexandria Art League, and the Capitol Hill Art Workshop. His work has been shown in numerous galleries throughout the greater metropolitan area.

It is unique for the Del Ray Artisans Gallery to be dedicated to one artist with such a large number of paintings and such a variety of subjects. You are strongly encouraged to visit the Gallery whenever you can. You will thoroughly enjoy yourself. All of Gilbert's paintings are for sale and his prices are very reasonable.

"Art on the Avenue" Exhibitor GUIDELINES, 2002

- All arts and crafts must be handmade. The Festival Committee shall have the right to remove any items on display that day which do not meet this requirement.
- Set-up will start at 7:30 AM Festival opens at 10:00 AM and runs until 6:00 PM. Breakdown must be completed by 7:00 PM.
- 3) Booth size is 10 feet by 10 feet. You cannot go out into the street more than ten feet from the curb.
- Exhibitors can provide their own table and chairs or rent them from "Art on the Avenue". (See sign up sheet for costs and ordering.)
- 5) Volunteer Block Captains will answer questions and assist vendors as needed throughout the day.
- Each exhibitor is personally responsible for the collection and reporting of Virginia Sales Tax (4.5%).
- 7) "Art on the Avenue" draws a lot of families with small children and pets. Please keep this in mind as you set up your display. You are responsible for protecting your merchandise.
- 8) The "Art on the Avenue" Committee is not responsible for loss, theft or injury incurred by any vendor.
- No more than two exhibitors can apply for and share a space. One person should be designated as the contact.
- Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their area presentable and clean. Trash must be picked up.
- Festival is held rain or shine.
- 12) Each registered artist/craftsperson will receive 50 "Art on the Avenue" postcards to mail to their customers.
- 13) If you have any special needs, please detail on your sign up sheet.
- 14) Space assignments will be made the day before the event. We try to accommodate special requests.
- 15) If you are interested in demonstrating your craft during the festival please indicate this on your sign up form.
