Framing Tip to Give You an Edge!

- 1. Mat in neutral shades of white, cream, gray and black. Avoid using colored mats for exhibitions.
- 2. Use acid-free mats and foam core backing. Regular mats break down over time turning the bevels and your artwork yellow. Brown cardboard and chipboard backing causes the same damage.
- 3. Use acid-free tapes for hinging your artworks on paper. No masking tape, duct tape, packaging tape or electrical tape! Tape ONLY on top. Taping art on every side causes buckling and waves, which can cause permanent damage to your artwork.
- 4. Contemporary art looks best when framed in wider mats and larger frames. Stay away from narrow mats. For example, an 8x10 work looks better in a 14x18 frame with a 3- to 4-inch mat than a 11x14 frame with a 1.5- to 2-inch mat.
- 5. Neatness counts! CLEAN glass to perfection inside and out. Mats must be spotless with no fingerprints, rips, scratches, hairs, etc. Frame corners must be neatly assembled without nicks or scratches. Finish with a hanging wire on back.

The April show, which runs April 13-29, is open to all DRA members whose dues are current. There is no fee for sub-

missions. Works in all media will be considered. DRA members may submit up to three works for consideration and are guaranteed that at least one of their submissions will be exhibited. Depending on the number of submissions and space availability, more than one piece may be selected for inclusion.

Receiving is scheduled for Friday, April 6, from 6:30-8 p.m., and Saturday, April 7, from 10 a.m. - 1 p.m. Works not selected must be picked up at the gallery on Sunday, April 8, from 4 - 6 p.m. Awards will be presented at the opening reception on April 13.
