

DRA Life Drawing Open Studio is Up and Running in 2007

Approximately twice a month, a stealthy group of DRA artists and friends come to the gallery to draw from a nude model.

The group is small allowing for input on pose, lighting, and length of pose. Artists freely move around the room searching for the best angle, and on occasion the whole group opts for a single three-hour pose.

"No matter your medium, we all have to keep our fundamentals in tune, and to me there's nothing more basic than working directly from life," says Joan Ulrich, who is primarily a clay artist.

If you haven't been to life drawing open studio yet, here's what to expect: each evening there is a designated host, who will help you get oriented in the gallery. Bring your own paper, supplies and an easel, if you need one.

The model starts promptly at 7 p.m., so arrive early to get acquainted and settle in. If you're unable to be on time, please come anyway. The gallery door will be locked, but knock and the host will let you in. They will help you quietly join the group and get set up.

The host will collect your fee, \$8 for DRA members, and \$10 for non-members, cash and checks accepted.

The evening typically starts out with about ten minutes of gesture poses, short poses which are held for a minute or less. Then we progress to longer drawings, three or four 5-minute poses followed by 15- or 20-minute poses or whatever suits the group! Short breaks happen about every half hour, or as needed by the model. We have a moment to stretch, admire our drawings, or grab a snack. We finish at 10 p.m.; however, on occasion the model will offer to stay a bit longer if needed to finish our masterpieces.

So, jump in, and take advantage of this opportunity to work from the model in our casual open studio. The upcoming dates are: March 14 and 28, and are always posted on the website, www.thedelrayartisan.org.
