n addition to encouraging our members to explore the suggested theme of "words" in their artwork, *Words, Art, and Poetry*, the spring DRA all member show, is featuring several special activities that rock both the right and left sides of the brain, including a visit from Bwana Papyrus. But before we tell you about those, here are a few important dates.

Receiving dates for submissions for the spring show are: Friday, April 6, from 6:30 p.m. until 8:30 p.m., and Saturday, April 7, from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. Submit up to three pieces of which

at least one will be exhibited. Works not included must be picked up on **Sunday**, **April 9 from 4 p.m. until 6 p.m.** Unless notified that ALL your works were accepted, you must pick up unselected work.

Show dates are April 13-29. The opening reception is Friday, April 14, 7-10 p.m. Cash awards will be presented by juror and local artist Jean Schwartz. Schwartz has a BA degree in fine art from Upsala College and a certificate from L'Ecole du Louvre in art history, specializing in 19th century French painting and architecture and sculpture of the Middle Ages. She studied drawing at L'Academie de La Grande Chaumiere also in Paris, and earned a certificate in landscape design from George

Washington University. She worked as a landscape designer for 12 years. Schwartz has had solo shows in Paris, upstate New York, North Carolina, and in the Washington, DC area.

Her work can be seen at the Art League Gallery at the Torpedo Factory. Recently, she was in the Vision Show for Falls Church Arts and had works ex-

> hibited at the Dega Gallery in McLean. Visit her Web site at www. jeanschwartzpaintings.com.

If you're interested in learning calligraphy, now's your chance. Sign up for Jenny Nicholson's calligraphy workshop, to be held on **Saturday, April 14, starting at 1:30 p.m.** The workshop is open to adults and children (ages 8 and up). There is a \$10 supply fee, and you can register on-line through the DRA Web site: www.TheDelRayArtisans.org.

Bwana Papyrus, as he is known in villages throughout the Nile River valley in Africa, is making an appearance at the gallery on **April 28, from 2:00 p.m. until 3:30 p.m.** Who is Bwana Papyrus? He is fiction writer and local resident John Gaudet, one of the country's preeminent authorities on papyrus paper making.

A Fulbright scholar to India and Malaya, author, and lecturer, Gaudet is bringing to DRA his exciting workshop, *Papyrus and the Origin of Bookmaking*, and his latest novel, *The Iron Snake*. And, you will not only get to make papyrus paper, but as a special treat, Gaudet will demonstrate proof of a fatal flaw in the widely, acclaimed thriller novel, *The DaVinci Code*. Hint: the flaw concerns the papyrus paper map leading to the Holy Grail that's inside

the marble cryptex. However, to discover what the fatal flaw is, as well as exploring the reedy plant and papyrus paper making, you must come to the workshop. The workshop is free but you must register online at www.TheDelRayArtisans.org.

The spring show's special events culminate on **April 28**, from **8 p.m. until 10 p.m.**, when the gallery becomes a performance art setting for the **Yockadot! Poetic Theatre Festival**. The evening starts at 8 p.m., with entertaining performances by **Rodrigo Toscano and his Collapsible Poetics Theatre**. At 9 p.m., you will be treated to performances by **Ffrummsbo!**, who offer ingenious, "text-based performance and performing writers, toward an aesthetic of grotesque lo-brow transcendentalism."

The Yockadot Poetic Theatre Festival is the first of its kind in our area, and DRA is pleased to be a part of this four-day event, which is being held in Alexandria, Arlington, and Baltimore. Additional information about the Yockadot festival may be obtained at www.yptfest.org.
