- 1. Reveal your latest creations and get a honest gentle opinion on your artwork from several art veterans and fresh faces—even a very mature 15 year old who just wowed everyone with his suggestions and insights! (I thought he was 23).
- 2. Group helps make recommendations on color usage, perspective, visual focus, and even techniques.
- 3. Hear suggestions on how to breathe new life into those unfinished pieces that have you stumped—maybe the results will be a successful NEW work that dazzles!
- 4. Find out how other artists are pricing their work and what goes into titling a piece. Our veterans have the low-down on dollars and sense for naming.
- 5. Learn priceless info on framing and professional presentation.

Cash Corner

ree money for artists abounds. The hard part is knowing where to look. It's getting harder to find these opportunities, as funding organizations prefer to give to established organizations rather than individuals.

One of my jobs as Fundraising Co-Chair for Del Ray Artisans is to search for grant opportunities to fund DRA's programs, this newsletter, our Web site and more. In this position, I occasionally run across grants that go directly to artists. Starting next month, I will publicize opportunities for individual artists, as I find them, here in this new column "Cash Corner."

While you wait for me to dig up some opportunities, you can pull together a few things that are pretty standard for all grant applications:

• Artist's Resume: Listing shows in which your work has been exhibited juried and non-juried, the month/ year and where. Include any artrelated volunteer work, and any art classes or workshops you've taken.

- Do not include the traditional job listings unless they are art-related, such as managing an art gallery.
- Artist's Statement or Narrative: A one-page description of your work that complements the resume. If you are looking for a grant to support a particular show of your work, then describe how your work and the show theme are unique. If you are looking for a grant for support of your overall portfolio, then describe the progress of your work—where you are and where you want to go. Tell your story.
- Art Samples: Many artists don't take the time in advance to identify their best works and produce good photos to include with your resme—usually requested as slides, or .jpg or .pdf files on CD. Be prepared for grant deadlines that often come up quickly. (In fact, I expect to have one for you soon with an August deadline!)

I hope that helps for now. Look for your newsletter next month and opportunities to help fund your projects!
