- 2. Request all newsletters & art subscriptions be received electronically
- 3. Paper artists make your own paper with a screen, blender and recycled paper
- 4. Use trash, found and/or recycle objects to make 3-D art
- 5. Look at your old art with new eyes remake it into a collage, paint over old canvases, recover, etc..

Make sure your e-mail includes (1) a description of what you want to swap and (2) contact info so interested parties can reach you to make arrangements for pick up or delivery. All swapping is up to the individual. DRA will merely offer the place to find each other.

At Home in Your Life August 2 • 7:30-8:00 p.m. (As part of Del Ray's First Thursday event for August) •

Cost: FREE

At Home in Your Life is a peek into the ways people can come home and embrace their individuality through creative expression. The session includes an exploration of inner home-wreckers—those negative thoughts and behavior patterns that keep people stuck in their comfort zones—and will explore ways of using art to bring awareness to those patterns and find ways to express them. "Shedding a creative light on our most ingrained thinking habits can really help turn them around."

There is no cost for At Home in Your Life. Those who are interested can stay and play with a few expressive exercises after the talk is done. This program is oriented for adults and may not be conducive to children. This program is presented by Jill Amstutz, DRA member, artist, and life coach.
