Five books about art and artists

- 1. de Kooning: An American Master by Mark Stevens and Annalyn Swan A very readable book, which not only details the life and work of the painter but also gives insight into the entire New York art scene from the 1930s through the 1960s.
- 2. Life with Picasso by Francoise Gilot and Carlton Lake Francoise Gilot is Paloma Picasso's mother. The short version is that living with Picasso was no picnic. This book provides fascinating details about his opinions on art as well as an inside look at how he lived and worked in the first 15 or so years after World War II.
- 3. The Art Spirit by Robert Henri Henri was a portrait painter and a member of the Ash Can School. He was a very influential art teacher in New York. This book is a collection of his articles, lectures, and letters about art and the process of creating art. Even though it is dated—from the very early part of the 20th Century—many of his teachings are as pertinent today. And, it contains some of the most eloquent descriptions ever written of what it means to be an artist.
- **4. Art and Fear** by David Bayles and Ted Orland This book—while not old (1993)—is already a classic. The authors have a keen understanding of what drives artists to create and why they sometimes do not do so. This book has the best description I have found of the emotions that artists experience during the process of producing their art.
- 5. Color by Victoria Finlay A history of some of our most common natural pigments, and a tour through the regions of the world where they originated. While the book is an easy read, the author is a scholar and references numerous other books on the history of color and pigment. If you're interested in color this is an excellent read.

Member Profile: Linda Elliff, The Gatherer

Whether an old-world glass bead, discarded compact mirror, vintage teacup or gear to a watch, they all provide creative fodder for DRA's new president, Linda Elliff.

Her artistic outpourings are beaded jewelry and three-dimensional collage, but she likes to dabble in all sorts of mediums and techniques, so her ever-expanding repertoire permits Linda to "mix it up" when creating, interjecting something unique and fresh.

A few years ago Linda and her husband visited the Czech Republic, where "beads" are called "jewelry". In the heart of the Czech jewelry cottage industry, she met families individually hand making glass beads, and she fell in love with their glass. "With the aid of a guide I sought out beads—a unique smokestack on a cottage is a clue to it being a bead-making house." These days, Linda buys her beads locally, but she is always on the lookout when traveling.

In keeping with her desire to dabble, Linda attended a DRA-sponsored workshop on faux-finishing a couple of years ago. That was her very first introduction to the organization that she has now been elected president of. And while one senses that Linda is as uneasy with the label "President" as she is with the label "Artist," it is also evident that she relishes the process of assembling a unique and beautiful creation from a menagerie of diverse findings such as we.
