#### January 2008 Show: Rejected/Accepted

ccording to Wikipedia, Salon des Refusés, French for "exhibition of rejects" is gener**ally, an exhibition of works rejected by the jury of the official Paris Salon, but most fa**mously the Salon des Refusés of 1863, which included, Édouard Manet's Luncheon on the Grass (Le déjeuner sur l'herbe) and James McNeill Whistler's Girl in White.

Del Ray Artisans is having its own show of rejected work in January. It will be called Rejected/Accepted. It is for all the work, leaning against the wall, whose genius has not yet been recognized. To qualify for this show, it is not necessary to be rejected by the Paris Salon. Any rejection will do. Even if is only your mother saying "Aw, Honey, what were you thinking?" That is sufficient rejection to qualify for this show. So get your best rejected work ready for exhibition, sign it, frame it and bring it to the drop off on January 5 from 2 to 4 p.m. or January 6 from 4 to 6 p.m. Since one of the primary aims of this show is to exhibit new work, it is requested that work previously exhibited at DRA not be included and of course, nothing with an Art League "Accepted" stamp is qualified.
