REJECTED/ACCEPTED

The tradition of showing art work that had been previously rejected has a long history. As early as the 1830s, Paris art galleries had mounted small-scale, private exhibitions of works rejected by the Salon jurors. In 1863, the event was sponsored by the French government. In that year, artists protested the Salon jury's rejection of more than 3,000 works, approximately 60% of those submitted, far more than usual.

"Wishing to let the public judge the legitimacy of these complaints," said an official notice, Emperor Napoléon III decreed that the rejected artists could exhibit their works in an annex to the regular Salon.

Despite the criticism of many critics, the show did provide exposure to many artists who were not famous then but are now. Del Ray Artisans is having its own show of rejected work in January. It will be called Rejected/Accepted. We have all had the experience of having our work rejected by show jurors. Jurors, unfortunately, like the critics of old are looking for what they expect to see. If they see something different, they often reject it because it is not what they were looking for. This show is for that work, the work that is in the studio, leaning against the wall, waiting to have its genius recognized.

To qualify for this show, any kind of rejection will do. So get your best rejected work ready for exhibition, sign it, frame it and bring it to drop off on January 5 from 2 to 4 pm or January 6 from 4 to 6 pm. Since one of the primary aims of this show it to exhibit new work, it is requested that work previously exhibited at DRA not be included and nothing that has won a prize is qualified.


