Curator Corner: Gallery Exhibit News

Our March show, "Spirit of Del Ray," was a great success, thanks to curator Seana Gallagher. Several artworks sold at the opening reception; more during the month. Many thanks to all who contributed to its success.

April's show, "Art Music" had a grand opening, thanks to curator Jamee Telford. Well over 100 pieces of art were submitted, and it was impossible to fit everything in, in part due to a greater than usual number of larger 2D works. This month's theme clearly inspired you all!

"Think Green" for our June show. Curated by Karen Schmitz with Jen Chappell, it challenges artists to interpret how we interact with and preserve our planet earth. Art can be a powerful medium for addressing important issues of our time. See further details in this this newsletter.

Our July show, "As We Are: The Enduring Nude" is seeking figurative works from area ar ists and will also feature the "regulars" at our Wednesday evening Life Drawing sessions. If you have not been attending over the past year, start coming regularly from now until the end of June in order to be considered for additional display of work created during these sessions. Details available soon at the sessions, online or from curators Michele Reday Cook and Joan Ulrich.

Curator Corner: Presentation of Artwork

We are in the process of establishing some consistency in DRA's standards for artwork submitted to our gallery. While individual curators have some leeway and flexibility in their shows, we want artists to know ahead of time if their work is presented appropriately for our gallery. Basic standards of presentation will remain consistent from show to show.

- * 2D work should be framed, or the sides of the canvas should be finished, painted, and/or integrated into the overall design of the artwork. 2D works (like watercolor, pencil, or pastel) on pape should always be matted, framed and under glass.
- * Works should be ready to hang, with wire firmly affixed to the frame, preferably with screw eyes. Sawtooth hangers are OK only with the smallest (6x8), lightest pieces, and not with works under glass.
- * 3D works (sculpture, multimedia, and other installations and assemblages) are unique and special handling/display instructions can be discussed with the curator, preferably ahead of time (written instructions are great) to make sure we can show your piece safely and effectively in our gallery.
- * DRA is committed to supporting new artists and we can help you learn how to show your work to its best advantage. Our Sunday afternoon critique sessions include presentation advice from professional framer, Karen Schmitz (next one in May). Curator Coordinators Michele and Jeanne are available to answer individual questions about art. Of course, the curator for the show you are entering has the final say, but do check ahead, as receiving for a new show is a very busy time and the curator will likely not be able to give undivided attention to you or your work then.
- * Read each call for entries carefully for information on requirements that apply to all shows, as well as learn about any special requirements for certain shows.

Why all these rules? Safety and Professionalism: to prevent damage to artwork (yours and others) or worse, injury to visitors; and to present DRA as a high-quality art gallery.

E-Mail Announcements and a New Feature Added to DRA Web Site

If you hadn't read the first DRA weekly e-mail we sent, then you may not know about recent changes we announced with regard to sending you e-mail announcements and a new feature added to the DRA Web site.

With regard to e-mail announcements, you told us, and we listened. As everyone receives many e-mails these days, which at times appear to be overwhelming, we implemented a new process earlier this month to keep you informed and limit the number of e-mails you receive from DRA.

Our plan is to send you announcements and information we receive that may be of importance and interest to you on a weekly basis rather than sending you e-mails as we receive such information. If we don't receive information during the week, then no e-mail will be sent. Of course, there may be an exception in which you receive more than one e-mail from DRA; however, we think doing this weekly will be beneficial for everyone.

The inaugural weekly e-mail was sent April 3 to all DRA members for whom we have e-mail addresses.

Another exciting change and value added benefit to DRA members recently implemented is the new feature added to the DRA Web site. As artists, we're all interested in knowing about exhibition opportunities to display our artwork. To help you with this, we added a feature on our Web site called, **Other Exhibition Opportunities**.

This is where we will put calls-for-entry that we receive from art groups, organizations, galleries, etc., outside of DRA. We believe this feature will be of great value to not only DRA artist members but also to our non-artist members. For our non-artist members, this feature can be used to find exciting upcoming art shows where DRA artist members may be exhibiting.

We also a link on our Web site specifically for DRA's art shows called, **DRA Call-for-Entries**. Both of these features can be found at the top of the home page.

Members Help Needed for DRA Adopt-a-Park Program

RA has been in the Adopt a Park program for approximately 10 years. The many DRA members who have earned hours towards their 10 required volunteer hours per year were rewarded with the honor of helping raise funds for DRA, improving the environment, and enjoying fresh air and sunshine. Those DRA members will be honored at the upcoming volunteer recognition party. DRA looks forward to 2008 and earning all of the 96 points!

It is a very simple way for DRA to gain some needed funds, improve the environment, help beautify the city, and get a little fresh air as well. We earned \$910 for our efforts in 2007. We can earn up to \$960, so we didn't loose too many points last year. With the new season starting, we need your help again. The first sign up dates start on April 5 or 6 and continue each weekend through the end of November.

DRA has adopted the Colasanto Park, next to the gallery/center. It is the parkland from the center/pool fence north to the intersection of Commonwealth and Mt. Vernon Avenues. City inspections take place on Monday mornings, so it is best to pick up the litter on Sundays, although Saturdays will work if that is what you can manage. We pick up from the tennis court and swimming pool fences north to the intersection, curb to curb. One point is taken off for each can, bottle, item or piece of glass, paper or other litter which the inspectors find. Since the gallery is normally open weekends until 4 PM, we recommend that you take a trash bag from the kitchen (boxes on the open shelves) or you can bring a bag with you. We pick up around the bus stop and the gallery but we are not scored on those areas. The trash bags are then to be place around the back of the gallery in the trash cans. The entire effort takes approximately 20 minutes to one half hour. This is a perfect way to fulfill some of your 10 hours of DRA volunteer commitment. We consider it an hour of volunteering toward your commitment.

Master Thesis -Syncretism: Paintings of Del Ray and Arlandria May 23 - June 1

Working full-time at Library of Congress, Jennifer Lea Hall learned of Virginia Commonwealth University's off-campus graduate art program from a professor at Corcoran College of Art, where she had taken most of the evening and weekend classes. "VCU makes it possible to earn a master's part-time in studio art," she explains, now at a non-profit representing newspaper First Amendment interests. It was a challenge transitioning. "At the Corcoran, one works from a model or still life twice a week for three hours except breaks. At VCU, classes are after hours in area high schools, with music from CDs and no model or still life."

Working with VCU adjuncts Margaret Boozer and John Figura, chair of Catholic University's art department, she quickly discovered what interested her: "the loss and recollection of symbols, layered over time and place, of successive immigrations and generations" evident in the Del Ray and Arlandria neighborhood where she lives. "From a family of secular Europeans who immigrated here a generation ago, I look at religious symbols of people sharing this community to see how symbols of art share their role. I find echoes in the area's diversity of exoticism of earlier modernist and symbolist painting traditions, and explore how they are present in real, contemporary American life around us."

Through paintings of Botanica San Elias in Del Ray, she learned of "syncretism," a form of assimilation she began to notice in her neighborhood. "The syncretic process results in a new synthesis, like layers of a pearl. From what I gathered, San Elias was a 12th century Carmelite prophet. But in Dominican Vodou, he is the spirit responsible for the dead, who likes gin and cigars and was invoked in ceremonies involving sacrifice or induced trances of horses."

With associations of communication with the unknown and sublime, it reminded her of synthètism, used to reference theories of the School of Pont Aven, a circle of artists in Brittany that included Paul Serusier (1863-1927) and Emile Bernard (1868-1941). "As in Baudelaire's poem Correspondences, I realized we wander among these hidden symbols `like dwindling echoes gathered far away'." Just as these painters sought cultures they sensed disappearing in an increasingly industrial age, "the exoticisms I encountered in Del Ray represented a resistance to materialism of our time, and excuse to paint something of the 19th century symbolic quality to which I was drawn, yet their presence in my neighborhood grounded them as contemporary realism."

DRA President Linda Elliff and longtime member Karen Schmitz invited Jennifer to exhibit as part of the Centennial celebrating 100 years of Del Ray.

Ultimately, Jennifer believes the work becomes about postcolonialism explored by Martin Puryear to Ansel Krut. "People associate exoticisms with the decorative and unfamiliar," Jennifer says. "But their resilience and mystery contain something potent and urgent beyond opulence. Practices layered beneath ours, represent an intuitive means of understanding beyond analytical reason that is synthetic and accessible by subjective experience."
