Self-portraits have been an artistic expression of self for centuries, in paint and sculpture and now new media are allowing artists to redefine the self-portrait as witnessed in the millions of pixilated images that are e-mailed, IM's, posted on Facebook and printed from the home computer everyday. Picture Me! is your opportunity to portray yourself as your truly are, wish you were, or pray that you are not. Woodworkers Collaborate with DRA in October

Del Ray Artisans returns to its roots literally and figuratively this October with a collaborative exhibit of recent work by members of the Washington Woodworkers' Guild (WWG) and by DRA members. When Del Ray Artisans first opened its doors, the focus was primarily on "functional art" and displayed objects for the "built environment." And many of those early furniture shows won critical acclaim. In June 1992, Into the Woods opened, featuring selected works by members of the Washington Woodworkers' Guild. The curators were Nick Bayus and Patsieann Misiti, and that show was the very first of several which have connected the WWG with Del Ray Artisans.

Beginning in November 2003, the connection was reestablished. Washington Wood 2003 and two years later,

Washington Wood 2005 were collaborative, juried exhibits. Both showcased the work of many talented woodworkers, their carvings, turnings and period furniture. In both of those years, complementary shows entitled Still Life, Landscape and Other Perspectives ran concurrently and featured a selection of wall mounted works by DRA members, giving the exhibits a homelike feel. In 2003, the shows were curated by Solon Candage and Martin Angebranndt. Sadly, Solon passed away in 2005, and Martin, a former President of DRA, assumed that challenging role for both groups.

The upcoming show will be curated by Ron Blank, himself a relic of the early days with DRA, and currently Secretary of the WWG: "The only difference between our October show and those most recent collaborations with WWG is the show's title, which we hope will add some punch to our marketing plans." Once again we expect the floor space to be filled with furniture and decorative objects crafted by the woodworkers and the walls to be graced with paintings, drawings and photographs, all interpreting this year's theme,

My students are the greatest people you can imagine, and they are now friends, too. Every one of the steady class members has, at one time or another produced a real winner. When they enter shows or sell work, I think I'm more excited than they are.

The next thing that I would like to try with my art is: Well, I've been hacking away with oils. They don't come as easily to me as watercolor, but I really want to get to a place where they feel natural to me.

What I really enjoy the most about being an artist is that it takes me away from everyday worries and distractions. When I'm painting, everything else in life melts away.

AS WE ARE: THE ENDURING NUDE Recap

In the Reday Cook and Joan Ulrich, co-curators for the July show, AS WE ARE: THE ENDURING NUDE, want to thank everyone who helped to make this an outstanding exhibit of figurative art.

The received about 90 works of art, of which 42 two-dimensional artworks and eight sculptures were selected. Our juror was Tania Karpowitz, local figurative artist and teacher. Two \$50 awards were made (a juror's choice and a curators' choice), plus five honorable mentions, each for a free life drawing session. In addition to the juried art, members of DRA's "Life Drawing Regulars" showed works on paper, unframed.

The show opened Thursday, July 3rd, to coincide with "First Thursday" events on the Avenue. Curators Michele and Joan arranged for a model and did demonstrations for gallery visitors during the evening. A closing reception on July 26th, with an art auction, ended the show on a festive note. Musician John Corcoran provided wonderful guitar music for the enjoyment of all who attended.
