From Our Trees Opens October 10

From the American Arts & Crafts inspired designs of furniture maker
Stewart Crick to the vibrant watercolors of Alice Kale. From the natural edge turned vessels of Patrick O'Brien to the serene views of Oscar and Emmy Award winning photographer John Hiller. Carvers and collage artists, sculptors and graphic artists all interpreting the theme, "From our Trees ... Artistry is Revealed" the collaborative exhibit that will open the fall season in the gallery this October.

Fifteen Del Ray Artisans members answered the call to join members of the Washington Woodworkers' Guild in their bi-annual exhibition. Curator Ron Blank promises it will be a splendid exhibition of juried work from both groups.

The Woodworkers Guild selections will be judged and awards presented by David Fry. His pieces have appeared at some two-dozen galleries nationwide, including del Mano in Los Angeles, and the craft shops of the Renwick and Hudson River Museum. From 1984 until its closure in last May, Bethesda's Sansar Gallery represented his work in the capital area. David has also written articles for Fine Woodworking magazine and Crafts Report.

The juror for the graphic art submissions from Del Ray Artisans is Charlene Fuhrman-Schulz. She began studying Chinese Brush painting in 1989, when she met Painting Master I-Hsiung Ju. To further her understanding of Chinese art and culture, she has traveled to mainland China on four occasions, and most recently to Taiwan. Charlene teaches at the Art League School in Alexandria. She has conducted numerous watercolor and ink workshops and been selected for several one-woman exhibits. Her work has been displayed by the Artists Undertaking Gallery in Occoquan since 1997 and more recently by Spirited Collections. Throw a Dart, Make Some Art!!!

re you up for a challenge? DRA is known for some awesome creative challenges and this in no exception. Ever fantasized about throwing a dart onto a map and landing on your next destination? What a journey it could be!

That is precisely what this challenge is about. "Object D'ART" is our way of taking artists on an uncharted path to creativity. Two dart boards will determine your journey. Participating artists will throw a dart to a board that will contain various art mediums such as paint, pen and ink, fiber, clay, photography, etc., then you aim a second dart on a second dart board. This board will have words, for example: "splendor", "freakish" or "musical", that will determine the theme of your artwork for this show. So you may, for example, throw your first dart to land on "paint" and your second dart may land on "musical" so the art piece you submit will be a painting with a musical theme. It doesn't matter if you are a painter or not. It is all about thinking out of your creative box to explore and play.

Participants are asked to pay a \$20 deposit for shots at the dart boards and will be reimbursed \$10 upon submitting your works. Join us at October's General Membership Meeting and November's card making event for dart throwing opportunities. "Object D'ART" exhibit will open in late February 2009.
