

#### Tribute to Peggy Kaufman

Alas for the world, one of her most fiery stars now will move only through the heavens and will no longer burn a trail of kinetic creativity on the earth. Peggy Kaufman, long-time DRA member/friend, artist and craftsperson, died on September 9, 2008, of multiple myeloma.

Although Peggy had not been as frequent a physical presence at DRA in recent years, she had a long history of spirited involvement and sharing of her considerable talents. She established her "Digital Prism" business and one time produced recycled items and furniture that benefited from her imaginative embellishments of mosaic work and found objects. Peggy also developed a highly successful line of polymer clay cane-design ornaments, as well as hand-painted "recycled" lightbulb ornaments, which were sold nationwide in retail venues and through catalogue sales. She also crafted fabulous bead jewelry, which she sold as a popular vendor at the Old Town Alexandria Farmers' Market and also at a shop in

Chincoteague, MD.
Peggy created with
passion and had a
brain that always
was working overtime. She found
both funky wonder
and fragile beauty
in most of what her
ever-inquiring eyes
took in. And they
didn't miss much.



Peggy Kaufman was a dear friend and a creative force, whose whirling dervish of a spirit endures, and whose wish was always that we honor the earth, "a planet worth keeping".
