- Title or theme and description of your exhibit
- Who is eligible (open to all or DRA only)
- Your submission requirements (juried, medium, subject matter, interpretation of theme)
- Possible dates
- Basic income/expense projections.

Last month, we promised you some ideas to get your own creative juices flowing. Some of these may even be ideas you gave us! Claim your own ideas quickly!

- Feature a specific medium (paintings, sculpture, photography, 3D...). These could also be collaborations with other organizations (fiber, wood, poetry groups, etc).
- Feature a specific theme or subject (still life, black & white, nature/landscape; our community; objects, architecture, street life, people).
- Do something we haven't done recently—an exhibit of abstract art?
- Perhaps juxtaposed with works of photorealism?

We could go on and on, but we would rather hear from YOU.

The deadline for proposals is August 1st. The updated proposal form will be available in the newsletter and online by early June.



DRA Will Award Art Scholarship

This May will mark the 10th time that DRA has awarded the Ted Eichers Memorial Art Scholarship to a T.C. Williams High School graduate who is attending college to continue his or her art education. The big news is that this year's recipient will receive \$1000, an increase over the \$600 awarded in the past.

The 2009 scholarship winner will be announced at the DRA Student Art show opening reception, May 1 from 7-10 PM. The scholarship will be presented at an awards ceremony on May 28th at 7 PM at the TC Williams Auditorium. DRA President Linda Silk, who has made the scholarship presentation for

several years says it's always a thrill to "to revisit that age when your future opens up in front of you and you have so many choices, so many opportunities. For a few hours, I envy every student at the award ceremony. While our contribution doesn't begin to cover the costs of their education, the students are grateful, and so are their parents, and they are certainly deserving."

The past awardees are Daniel Krahn (2000), Brian McCarthy (2001), Kimberley Burke (2002), Caroline Gullickson (2003), Michaela Murphy (2004), Claire Schoen (2005), Keriann Cassidy (2006), Thomas Carroll (2007), and Olivia T. Morrow (2008).

Keriann Cassidy, who is studying at the Fashion Institute of Technology in New York City, says, "Supplies can be very expensive so having the scholarship helped me with buying my textbooks, as well as numerous supplies that I constantly use. Though I haven't followed the fine arts path, I believe that

fashion design is a way for me to express myself artistically and the Ted Eichers Scholarship has helped me make my dreams for my future come true."

Scholarship recipients are selected by a committee of teachers based on the criteria set by DRA. The student must have at least a B average, show extraordinary potential in art and be planning to major in an art-related field.

The scholarship is named for Ted Eichers, a DRA member who passed away in 1997, whose art and volunteerism exemplified the spirit of DRA. Ted studied art at Northern Virginia Community College after he retired. He created intricate scenes with wood veneers that he shared, along with his companionship, with nursing home residents, jail inmates, and at-risk youth in Alexandria, Ted's wife, Alice, serves on the Scholarship Committee along with two sons, Tim and Danny. Alice says, "The choice to study any graphic art form is a huge leap of faith in your talent. I think far more than the small monetary stipend, being selected for the scholarship is an affirmation of that choice."

DRA Treasurer Marlin Lord says the scholarship is funded "through donations earmarked for the (Ted Eichers) scholarship fund and interest on DRA accounts over the years." Account interest enabled DRA to raise the scholarship amount this year. The ultimate goal is to fund the scholarship entirely by donations.

This year donations got a boost from "The Snipping" event where DRA Assistant Treasurer, Kathyrn Brown, cut her hair to donate to Locks of Love. Supporters of that event donated over \$550 to benefit the DRA's scholarship fund.

Tax-deductible contributions to DRA's Ted Eichers Memorial Art Scholarship Fund are welcome at any time.
