Mixed Media Multiplied

Picture this: Sand sprinkled on wet acrylic paint. Mosaic tesserae, colored pebbles, shells, and twigs arranged into something surprising. Paper, cardboard, charcoal, and pastels combined to make a relief sculpture.

Don't just picture it. Curator Jeanne Tifft urges you to use your creative ingenuity to produce original work for the Mixed Media Multiplied show at the Del Ray Artisans Gallery June 26 to July 19, 2009. Use a combination of three or more traditional media and materials to create a unified two-dimensional or three-dimensional work of art that embodies a new and unexpected visual experience. A number of DRA members produce various kinds of mixed media art works, demonstrating extraordinary imagination and ingenuity. This is an opportunity for other members to experiment with some combination they've never tried before. Every DRA member is guaranteed at least one work will be exhibited, as long as it qualifies as a true mixed media work. If a theme helps to spark your ideas, think "summer!"

Exhibitors must be current members of DRA to submit work. Entry fee is \$3.00 each for up to three original works. You may enter art not for sale (NFS) or priced to sell. All entries must be ready to hang securely or display. Deliver and pick up your sold and unsold work on the designated days and times.

Exhibitors must sign up for a gallery-sitting time slot during the run of the show. Help is needed as well at intake (June 21 and 22, 6 - 9 p.m.) and hanging (June 23 and 24, day and/or evening at volunteers' convenience), including, possibly, rides to the gallery.

Receiving will be on Sunday and Monday, June 21 and 22 from 6 to 9 p.m. Pickup date for work not included in the show is Wednesday, June 24, from 6 to 9 p.m.

This will be the second all-member show for 2009. The opening reception at the Gallery is on Friday, June 26, 7 - 10 p.m. Bring your friends to this event, which is free and open to the public. There is handicapped access.

Revenge of the Sequel - Entry Deadline is July 24

Revenge of the Sequel, the first of its kind exhibition in the country, is a juried art show providing artists the opportunity to unleash their talents to create an image(s) that depicts and conveys their uninhibited and unabashed versions of a sequel. You, the artist, are essentially creating the concept and image of a sequel to any movie (underground, mainstream, etc.), play, book, opera, television show, a sequel of sequel, or whatever you think lends itself to becoming a sequel. The sky's the limit on this, and the only restriction is your imagination. This is an all media exhibition open to all artists (videographers should contact the curator for additional details before proceeding).

Although the show opens in September, the reason for the July 24 submission deadline is because the review of artwork is being done differently, with time needed to complete this process. Artwork entered must be submitted on CDs, no slides (though, this not the first time DRA has done this). The juror for this show is Jean Schwartz, a wellrespected Northern Virginia artist who has had solo shows in Paris, upstate New York, and Washington, D.C. Her works also have been exhibited in numerous galleries in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area. Schwartz received her degree in fine art from Upsala College and a certificate from L'Ecole du Louvre in art history. She also studied drawing at L'Academie de La Grande Chaumiere in Paris and has a breadth of knowledge of various art forms, techniques, and media. Entry fees are: DRA members, \$20; nonmembers, \$30. Artists may submit up to



three images for the nonrefundable entry fee. If you want to submit more than three works, you may do so for an additional \$10 per image. Artists accepted are required to gallery sit during show dates. All artwork must be for sale. Show dates are September 4-27. Curator is David A. Kosar, 703-836-5483, david.kosar@verizon.net.

Re-String Your Bling! Workshop

Remember that earring that you were sure you'd find its mate? That necklace that you were so convinced would come back in fashion but hasn't? Perhaps that lone earring and the throw-back necklace could be re-purposed, recycled and refashioned into a brand new piece! This is not about repairing the pearls that were passed down through the family, but a way for you to take your unworn costume jewelry and make it rock! Students will bring in broken and/or outdated jewelry as well as any tools for jewelry they may have on hand from home.

The ever high-energy jewelry designer, Jen Judd will cover some basic beading/wire-working skills(stringing, crimping, simple loops, wrapped loops and jump rings) as well as lead a discussion about the different types of materials (beads, metal, wire) available. She will focus on different price levels so you will learn your options, providing handouts with the basics plus a reference list for future use. Jen's work can be seen in the Spring issue of "Stringing" magazine as well as her website www.jenjuddrocks.com.

After getting through some basic instruction, Jen will work one-on-one with students to develop design and help with technical solutions. The class fee of \$35 will include some "make and take" supplies including beading wire, crimps, clasps, pins, hooks and work surfaces(pads and stringing trays).

Prior to class, for those enrolled, discount coupons for two local bead merchants-Bead Obsessions in Old Town Alexandria and Off the Beading Path in Occoquan will be provided. There will be additional basic supplies/tools available for purchase directly from Jen. She is encouraging everyone to bring jewelry and any supply (beads, wire and tools) they may already have on hand for a trade or swap.

This class is intended for adults of any skill level and is handicap accessible.
