FROM THE CURATORS' CORNER:

To increase the likelihood of your artwork getting selected for shows, don't overlook the importance of proper presentation. Well-executed art that is poorly presented risks rejection because it looks unprofessional. Thus, unframed, inappropriately framed (using wrongly sized "ready-made" mats and frames), unfinished canvas, or frames without wire and screw eyes (please do NOT us any "sawtooth" hangers) appear amateurish, unfinished (as though the artist didn't care), and just not as good as other work that gets accepted.

If you don't seem to care about your artwork, why should a juror or curator? Visit local galleries and museums for ideas--see how the art is displayed and bring those ideas to your own artwork. Also, mark your calendars for a "framing basics" workshop being planned for September. Stay tuned for details and registration.

CALLING ALL FINE ART & FINE CRAFT EXHIBITORS!

I know it's hot outside and there's not a snowflake to be seen but we are starting to plan NOW for DRA's Holiday Market! Want to sell your art & craft goodies at the Holiday Market the first weekend in December? If so, then check out the Holiday Market Application included in this newsletter (or on our website)!

Why is there an application process? Because gallery space is limited and the mix of goods available at the Market is kept in balance. The registration deadline is Friday, September 3, 2010 so don't delay! Fill out the application now and send it in with your payment and up to 3 pictures of your work. Vendor notification will be on Monday, September 20, so vendors who are accepted will have plenty of time to advertise and build inventory for the Holiday Market.

UNDECIDED: A DIALOG BETWEEN

ARTIST & VIEWER, our all-member show, opened to enthusiastic reviews on June 4th. Viewers really took to the concept of naming the untitled artworks on display, with some art receiving over a dozen titles. This close attention to the art resulted in strong sales that night as well.

Curators Betty Plummer and Michele Reday Cook want to thank DRA members for submitting such fine art for this show and wish they could have displayed every piece submitted. For this show, 63 members submitted a total of 145 works, of which there was only room on the walls for about 100 pieces, plus a few 3D works on pedestals. In contrast, the April "Bag" show hung about 45 works; and the May thesis show, only 25. There was enough art turned away for an entire additional exhibit--and all of it was excellent!
