

Join us for the Opening Reception: light refreshments served, excellent art presented, and interesting people attending. Everyday life is under the microscope resulting in some touching, heartbreaking, comforting, and disturbing artworks. Life and art certainly bring out emotions!

Show artwork may be purchased at any time, but must remain on display until the last weekend (October 1-2). The "Art for everyday life" market is stocked with fine handcrafts and shrink-wrapped artwork—the aesthetics that enhance everyday life.

Purchase and pick up market artwork immediately.

Get a sneak peek of the exhibit on First Thursday, Sept. 1 from 6–9 pm. The First Thursday theme is Home Sweet Home—and some of the art certainly hits the mark.

Stop by the gallery during Art on the Avenue, Saturday, October 1 from 10 am–6 pm. Over 50,000 people attended this community event last year, enjoyed the food from local restaurants, and shopped from more than 300 craft vendors and artisans. Collage Workshops with Smithsonian Artist Lori K. Gordon

Saturday, October 29-Day 1: Learn techniques to create small collages with organic shapes & torn paper Sunday, October 30-Day 2: Learn more advanced techniques to build complex collages

Lori Gordon has been featured on national media outlets including CBS, NPR, and CNN. You may remember her from DRA's Southern Surge show in 2007 to benefit Gulf Coast artists affected by Hurricane Katrina. She was one of a dozen Mississippi Coast artists who gave a 2-day workshop in conjunction with the show.

Both workshops are 9 am - 4 pm. Cost for DRA members: \$115 for one day or \$210 for both days. Cost for non-members: \$130 for one day or \$240 for both days. Supply fees: \$15 for one day or \$25 for both days cover homemade/found papers, support panels, glues, and photographic images from the artist's collection. Bring your own images too!
