Recent Sales Stats

Overall comparing 2020 to 2019 sales (Jan 1-Oct 25 each year), Del Ray Artisans has made 31% less. This is an improvement of 3% from last month's figures. We are proud of the overall performance during a very difficult year, and the organization remains on-track to balance this year's budget.

In the *Art in Movement* exhibit (Sept 2020), 14 pieces sold and brought in \$1,042 in artists' sales; plus an additional \$343 in donations & Souk sales which benefited DRA directly. Thank you to the artists for donating a percentage of sales to DRA too.
