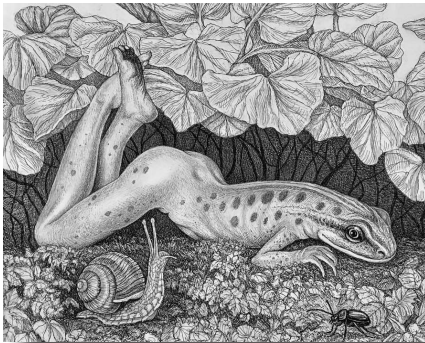

Come see *The Naked and the Newt: Studies in Human and Herpeton Anatomy* art exhibit to see how artists explore the human body and reptiles / amphibians / herpetons. This exhibition investigates conceptions of anatomy, texture, and conservation with our partners, the Virginia Herpetological Society.

Reserve a ticket at naked-and-newt.eventbrite.com for a half-hour viewing during the extended hours on opening day, Friday, June 4 between 12-8pm. Opening day tickets are not required, but ticket holders have priority entry. The gallery capacity is limited to 10 people at any one time in order to facilitate social distancing.

Del Ray Artisans is honored to showcase over five decades of photography from longtime member, Oscar and Emmy winner John W. Hiller with a special two-week exhibit. Calling Alexandria home for 40 years, John was an active member of Del Ray Artisans and volunteered his expertise for years as the Historian and Director of Archives. Working as a filmmaker and cinematographer "The Stone Carvers" won him an Oscar for Documentary Short in 1984. John was born in Altadena, California in 1935 and passed away in 2020 at the age of 84. 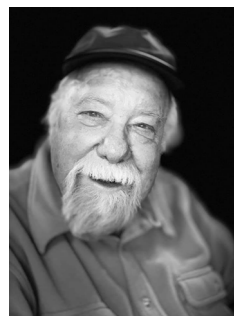

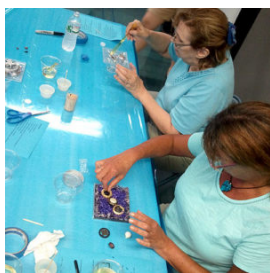
Outdoor: Live Animal Drawing – Texture Focus Saturday, June 12, 11am-5pm



Come practice sketching or painting natural textures with live models Persephone (Gila Monster), Flicker (Blue tongue Skink), Pyxel (African Pixie Frog), Cookie (Western Hognose Snake) and two more snakes (a Rat Snake and Timber Rattlesnake). Six socially-distanced chairs will be

set up around a critter-containing vivarium under a canopy outdoors near the gallery. Seven dollars for a 30-minute session with one animal. Register by June 9.

Playing with Resin – Focus on Texture Sunday, June 13 or Monday June 14, 6-9pm

hands-on activity, suitable for high school age and adults. Register by June 14.

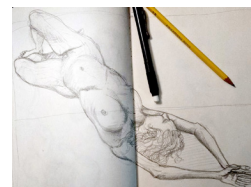
Online: Crochet for Beginners Saturday, June 19, 1-3pm

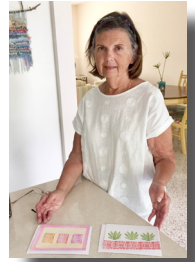
ONLINE: Turtles of Virginia: Life History and Conservation **Friday, June 25, 6:30-7:30pm**
